

Survey on AA and NHPI Community Arts Initiatives

Background: National CAPACD is conducting an <u>online survey</u> on community arts initiatives by Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander (AA and NHPI)-serving organizations. The distribution of the survey will draw on National CAPACD's extensive network of organizations across the country, including projects and organizations identified through the <u>AA and NHPI Creative Placemaking Learning Circle</u>. The survey results will contribute to a better understanding of arts-related work performed by AA and NHPI serving organizations, focusing on the impacts of this work on community capacity-building.

Research question and goals: How do AA and NHPI-serving organizations view the impact of community arts initiatives on community capacity-building? This survey aims to collect data related to this research question, as well as general descriptive and qualitative data that can be used to understand the landscape of community arts initiatives within AA and NHPI communities and organizations.
